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## The purpose of this policy

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that The Cairnmillar Institute (the Institute) meets the highest intellectual and academic standards.

## Essay Lay-out

Essays must be on International Standard Paper Size A4 (measuring 297mm x 210mm).

- Sheets must be numbered consecutively and clearly.
- Margins must be 3cm, uniform on all sheets.
- The essay must be typed in double or 1 ½ line spacing.
- The essay must be submitted in a size equivalent to 12 point Arial font.

## Essay Format

Each essay must include a title page including the full title of the essay; full name of the author; the unit and the name of the unit and course for which the essay is submitted; the name of the Institute; the name of the unit co-ordinator and the month and year the essay is submitted.

The remainder of the essay must comply with the following:

- The main text would typically include the following components:
  - an abstract,
  - an introduction to the topic including an overview of the literature,
  - the main body of the essay including support from the literature to support the argument, and case descriptions where appropriate,
  - discussion,
  - conclusions
  - references
- A student's own words must be used in writing the essay, except where quotes are indicated by quotation marks or offsetting, and referenced accurately
- Language that stereotypes human beings or communities on the basis of their race, colour, class, religion or gender must not be used
- Essays must be written in complete sentences, and in paragraphs (of 3 or more sentences), with each paragraph separated by a double return
- All assessments must comply with the APA style guide (6<sup>th</sup> ed.) at [www.apastyleguide.com](http://www.apastyleguide.com)
